2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

A business man was selling a warehouse and its property. The building had been empty for months and needed repairs. Vandals had damaged the doors, smashed the windows, and strewn trash around the inside. He builds something brand new. The one that wrote 2 Corinthians 5:17 was for sure changed into a new creature. Apostle Paul whose name was Saul before his conversion was one of the worst persecutor of Christians. He had Christians arrested and killed. He was a Pharisee. He kept the law of Judaism.
